HISTORICAL FICTION/BOOKS IN VERSE

Lifeboat 12 by Susan Hood

With Nazis bombing London every night, it's time for thirteen-year-old Ken to escape. He is one of ninety boys and girls to ship out aboard the SS City of Benares to safety in Canada. Life aboard the luxury ship is grand—nine-course meals, new friends, and a life far from war. And after five days at sea, the ship's officers announce that they're out of danger. But later that same night, an explosion hurls Ken from his bunk. They've been hit and The Benares is sinking fast. Terrified, Ken scrambles aboard Lifeboat 12 with five other boys. Will they survive?

REALISTIC FICTION/BOOKS IN VERSE

The Canyon's Edge by Dusti Bowling

Nora and her father are exploring a canyon deep in the Arizona desert, hoping it will help them find peace after a traumatic event. But when they reach the bottom of the canyon, a flash flood sweeps away Nora's father and all of their supplies. Suddenly, Nora finds herself lost and alone in the desert, facing dehydration, venomous scorpions, and, worst of all, the Beast who has terrorized her dreams for the past year. If Nora is going to save herself and her father, she must conquer her fears, defeat the Beast, and find the courage to live her new life.

REALISTIC FICTION

Small as an Elephant by Jennifer Richard Jacobson

Ever since Jack can remember, his mom has been unpredictable, sometimes loving and fun, other times caught in a whirlwind of energy and "spinning" wildly until it's over. But now she is gone, leaving him all alone on a campsite in Maine. Can he find his way back to Boston before the authorities realize what happened? Jack soon undertakes a journey that tests his wits and his loyalties.

FANTASY

Race to the Sun by Rebecca Roanhorse

Lately, seventh grader Nizhoni Begay has been able to detect monsters, like a man who was at her basketball game. Turns out he's Mr. Charles, her dad's new boss, and he's alarmingly interested in Nizhoni and her brother and their Navajo heritage. When Dad disappears the next day the siblings and Nizhoni's best friend, Davery, are thrust into a rescue mission. After a series of dangerous—and mind-bending—trials, Nizhoni, Mac, and Davery finally reach the sun god, who outfits them with the weapons they need to take down Mr. Charles and the ancient monsters he has unleashed.

DYSTOPIAN

The City of Ember by Jeanne DuPrau

The underground city of Ember was built as a last refuge for the human race. Two hundred years later, the great lamps that light the city are beginning to dim. When Lina finds part of an ancient message, she's sure it holds a secret that will save the city. Now, she and her friend Doon must race to figure out the clues to keep the lights on. If they succeed, they will have to convince everyone to follow them into danger. But if they fail? The lights will burn out and the darkness will close in forever.

GRAPHIC NOVEL (MEMOIR)

When Stars Are Scattered by Victoria Jamieson with Omar Mohamed

Omar and his younger brother, Hassan, have spent most of their lives in Dadaab, a refugee camp in Kenya. Life is hard there: never enough food, achingly dull, and without access to the medical care Omar knows his nonverbal brother needs. So when Omar has the opportunity to go to school, he knows it might be a chance to change their future . . . but it would also mean leaving his brother, the only family member he has left, every day. Heartbreak, hope, and gentle humor exist together in this graphic novel about a childhood spent waiting.
