MEETING NOTES

Head of School Mr. O'Keefe opened the meeting at 6:30pm with Middle School Asst Principal Papillo, School receptionist (and parent) Ms. Carlucci, and several parents in person and on zoom.

Old Business

Parent Wendy Marshall asked for a Treasurer update and parent Martha Dennison reported that the Group has \$1100 on account from last year.

New Business

Administration Update

Mr. O'Keefe provided an update on the 25th anniversary events that took place in late September.

- 9/28 Gala. Organized by the Board, the adults-only event was well-received with 4 of the original 7 Board members in attendance. Several new families were represented and about 1/3 of the staff was able to attend. The student band, made up of seniors, was a big hit.
- 9/30 Family Event. The Family Event held on the field at school was significantly affected by the rainy weather, which nearly ruined the fun. But the student government members were amazing leaders overseeing the obstacle course bounce house and the face painting. Everyone who did come out really enjoyed themselves. The school is interested in seeing the Parent Group and student government partner to make this an annual event to engage families and make connections early in the school year.

Grade Push-out Update - Mr. O'Keefe also offered an update on the new bi-weekly practice of '**Grade Push-out**,' which was introduced on 9/25. The grade portal information was kept linked to the family portal for the week and was very well-received. There are concerns that one week is too long, as the data becomes slightly flawed as time goes on.
