



Upper School Club Descriptions & Schedule 2024-2025

Lunch Clubs:

Animation Club (Whelan)

Animation club is a place where students can learn, discuss, and watch animation. All students are allowed to recommend and propose any animation to watch and all decisions are made by democratic voting by all members. Everyone is welcome. We will talk about animation, its history, how it evolved, and what makes good animation.

Automotive Club (Harvey)

Automotive Club is for anyone who loves anything or everything about cars. Students will share ideas about car maintenance, car repairs, recent trends, and their passion for automobiles.

Bowling Club (Senegal)

Students gather together to learn about the sport of bowling. The club watches professional bowling, learns different styles and techniques, as well as discussing their passion for the sport.

Chess Club (Catelli)

We play chess! This group will meet on Mondays & Fridays during lunch and is open to all Upper School students. In the spring students organize a tournament amongst club members who choose to participate.

Contemporary Issues Club (Brodeur)

Students gather together to discuss current events and issues in our society. The club looks to find solutions to complex problems facing teenagers, as well as the world.

Dance Club (Connelly)

The dance club is open to any students in grades 9-12. The work that is created and the organization of the group will be mostly student driven. The Club leaders will direct warm up and design choreography for the group to perform. The choreography is designed to include all of the dancers in the club. Dance Club typically performs at Arts night in the winter and spring, and at showcases. Attendance is a very important component to this club. Consistent attendance is necessary in order to learn and develop the works. Dance club is a joyful space where students can explore and magnify their performance skills.

DBIE Student Work Group (Martz)

The Diversity, Belonging, Inclusion, and Equity (DBIE) student workgroup is open to all students in grades 9-12. Students come together to share, discuss, and proactively address issues of injustice and inequity within our community. Members of this group individually reflect on and share how injustice impacts our lives, the lives of others in our school community, and members of minority groups. Group members also seek to determine practical action steps with clear timelines for increasing diversity, belonging, inclusion, and equity in our school community.

Fashion Club (Henderson)

Fashion Club is where students have one-on-one experiences to learn about textiles, craftsmanship, and the art skills needed in the fashion industry.

Feminist Club (Henderson)

As we evolve, so does the way that societies begin to see and treat women/non-binary people. It is important that as a community we continue to learn and grow from building each other up. Rising Tide's Feminist Club hopes to educate our young pupils as we create a safe and steady environment for female students. We hope to have premade slideshows about certain feminists/important dates in feminist history for most meetings. The dream is to have visitors with strong ties to female rights in the past or present. The power of positive feminism builds confidence for future generations of students and Feminist Club plans to create this legacy through empowerment of the female community.

LGBTQ+ and Allies (Barnhard)

This group provides a forum in which students can discuss LGBTQ+ issues and promote belonging for and allyship with LGBTQ+ individuals in the Rising Tide community. The main goal is to support a sense of belonging and to ensure equality. The group is open to all Upper School students.

Model UN (Remeysen)

Model UN is for simulations of the United Nations General Assembly and its other multilateral bodies. Students perform in an ambassador role while debating topics.

Music Club (Whittaker)

Students gather together and listen to various genres of music. While listening to these different genres, students engage in discussion breaking down the music and lyrics. Students occasionally also play musical instruments to further their passion and understanding of various music genres.

National Honor Society (Campbell)

Membership in the NHS is by invitation and based on service, character, leadership, and scholarship.

Photography Club (Martz)

Students take photos and work on editing and building portfolios. The club will be attending various events throughout the school year taking photos of the community in action.

Prom Committee (Martz)

Students gather to discuss the preparations for the Senior/Junior Prom. Students are organized into committees to design decorations, determine fundraising activities, plan the theme, and other elements of planning Prom.

Roller Skating Club (Connelly)

Students roller skate together during lunch periods once a week in the movement space. Students create different playlists of music to roller skate to. Students also teach and learn how to roller skate in various styles.

Safe Space Club (Connelly)

Students meet during lunch in a small group setting with Ms. Connelly in the Dance Room. It's a space for students who do not feel comfortable with the hustle and bustle of lunch to sit and eat in a quiet area.

Senior Committee (Lish)

Senior students gather to discuss events and fundraising ideas to help make their last year of school as memorable as possible.

Sports Club (Haskins and Doyle)

Sports Club is open to all students in grade 9-12. It's a club for anyone interested in sports of any kind to make new friends and connect about current sporting news, discuss fantasy sports, and even participate in some friendly competitions amongst the school community.

Student Government (Martz)

Student Government is open to all students in grades 9 - 12 and students can attend even if they are not elected representatives or officers. In this club, students will expand on their leadership skills by representing their fellow students and addressing student body concerns and ideas with School Leaders. They will also plan events, including Prom in the spring, and help with other activities around the school when possible, such as Open House events.

Science Club (Lish)

Students will discuss various topics in the science arena from physics, to chemistry, to biology, and many more.

Theatre Club (Barnhard/Mainster)

Students organize ideas for after school theatre productions. Students also work together to find resources we need to put on our after school theatre productions and make our productions better.

Yearbook (Llera)

The Yearbook Club is open to students in grades 9-12. It is a club for anyone who is interested in helping with the development of the school yearbook. Students will work as a club to collect photos, organize information, create page layouts, and design the 2024-2025 yearbook.

After-School Clubs:

Animal Crossing (Reilly)

Students meet on Tuesdays after school to play Animal Crossing on their Nintendo Switches. They have fun creating different worlds and exchanging game ideas.

Dungeons and Dragons Club (Catelli/Smilan/Llera)

In Dungeons & Dragons, the players form an adventuring party who explore fantasy worlds together as they embark on epic quests and level up in experience. The Dungeon Master (also known as the DM) is the game's referee and storyteller. Students gather three times a week after school to participate in their epic quests.

Junior Classical League (JCL) (Mr. Whelan)
